## **AKBC-KABC Future Leaders Program 2018**

### **Future Leaders Program overview and objectives**

The Future Leaders Program provides an exceptional opportunity for young professionals to participate in the AKBC-KABC Joint Meeting and associated functions, as well as a specific session for Future Leaders Program delegates.

The 2018 AKBC-KABC Future Leaders Program will be held as part of the 39<sup>th</sup> AKBC-KABC Joint Meeting from 29 – 30 October, 2018 in Busan, South Korea.

The objectives of the program are to help participants:

- Obtain a deeper level of understanding of the opportunities and challenges in the Australia-Korea bilateral relationship
- Learn from industry experts about current market trends
- Gain access to a network of similar aged and like-minded delegates that are actively working in a business directly related to strengthening the Australia-Korea relationship
- Network with senior business executives attending the Joint Meeting and associated events
- Develop skills and networks that position them to take leadership of their organisations Korea strategy.
- Develop management skills needed to excel in the Asian Century.

One member of the AKBC-KABC Future Leaders Program will be invited to provide a five-minute report back to the main forum at the AKBC-KABC Joint Meeting on 30 October, 2018.

### **Details of the AKBC-KABC Future Leaders Program 2018**

Participants of the Future Leaders Program are given access to and expected to participate in all other parts of the broader AKBC-KABC Joint Meeting, including the Australian Delegation breakfast, AKBC-KABC Joint Meeting and closing cocktail reception.

### **Eligibility**

Applicants to the AKBC-KABC Future Leaders Program must:

- Work for a company that is an AKBC member OR be nominated by an AKBC member representative (if not an AKBC member)
- Be aged between 25 and 40 as at the time of application
- Be an Australian or Korean citizen
- Have a strong command of the English language
- Be able to demonstrate a proven professional track record and their commitment to the Australia–Korea relationship; and
- Be willing and able to participate in all sessions, activities and events in the Future Leaders program.
