JooYoung is a design architect and the Korea representative for Populous. He is also involved in the marketing and business development for Korea, and is a highly skilled architect and designer with a strong understanding of engineering solutions.

JooYoung joined Populous in 2005, and since this time has been instrumental in developing Populous' presence in Korea. Populous' first project in Korea was the design for the main stadium for the Incheon 2014 Asian Games. JooYoung was the Project Coordinator for the Incheon Stadium, working in a liaison role between the client and design team, both in Australia and Korea. JooYoung also designed the landscaping and bridge which connects the stadium to the park. Incheon Stadium is a great example of sustainable design. The stadium had a capacity of 60,000 during the Games and is designed to reduce to 30,000 to provide a people's park for the community of Incheon.

JooYoung designed the plaza and retail component of the Taipei Dome in Taiwan and was Project Architect for Zhuhai Tennis Centre, an international standard tennis facility in China. He was the main architect working on the designs for the buildings, landscape and master plan. He also was the Design Architect for the NC Dinos Baseball Stadium, working alongside Populous' commercial activation team to design an enhanced fan experience to unlock the commercial revenue potential of the facility.

Most recently, JooYoung has been working on the design for the Hebei China Fortune Football Club new professional training centre. The training base is for one of the biggest clubs in the China Super League will be the first within their football industry to cater for everyone from the youth training academy right through to the reserve and first teams.
